Guiding Question One

Where have I seen successes and distresses within the Church's structures, organization, leadership, and life that encourage or hinder the mission?

Guiding Question Two

How can the structures and organization of the Church help all the baptized to respond to the call to proclaim the Gospel and to live as a community of love and mercy of Christ?



1. The Synod Listening Session for Human Dignity and Life

Successes:

Community and Common Purpose: There is a recurring emphasis on the importance of fostering a sense of community and shared goals within the Church. This includes coming together to create common goals, emphasizing family and communal bonds, and engaging in collaborative efforts both within the parish and with other organizations.

Spiritual Growth and Renewal: There is a commitment to spiritual nourishment, renewal, and growth within the Church. This involves missionary discipleship, discernment practices guided by the Holy Spirit, engagement in orthodox liturgies, and participation in retreats and healing ministries.


11. The Synod Listening Session for Schools

Successes:

Pastoral Leadership: The importance of priests and leaders within the Catholic Church who are compassionate, welcoming, and actively engaged in the community.

Catholic Identity and Education: The significance of Catholic schools, hospitals, charities, and education programs in nurturing faith and serving the community.

Youth Engagement: Strategies for connecting with young people and fostering their involvement in the Church through homiletics, youth groups, and education initiatives.



Community Building: Efforts to strengthen the sense of belonging and fellowship within parish communities, including through family events, focus groups, and small group activities.

Successes:
