## Area women religious celebrate jubilees of 50, 60, 70, 75, and 80 years

GREEN BAY, Wis. (Aug. 8, 2019) – Bishop David L. Ricken will celebrate a Sisters' Jubilee Mass on Sunday, August 11, at 1:30 p.m. at St. Bernard Parish, Green Bay, to honor 33 women celebrating jubilees in religious life. Their combined service totals nearly 2,000 years. The theme for this year's jubilee celebration is "Called to Live Lives of Faith."
